We need foster parents!

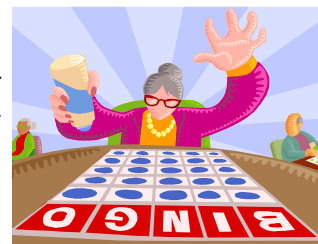
Have you always wanted a kitten but don't have the time to commit to a new pet?

Wanted: Small Animal Socializers

The small animal room, located just a few steps from the volunteer sign in desk, is a busy place these days. With many rabbits being brought in from the House Rabbit Society, our small animal room is currently overflowing with loving bunnies (as well as ferrets and guinea pigs) who need just as much socializing as the shelter cats and dogs. As with any animal at the shelter, the more we handle the small animals, the friendlier they will be when potential adopters come to see them. If you have some spare time, please consider spending a few minutes in the small animal room petting, holding, or playing with the many sweet animals awaiting their forever home. When handling the small animals, please keep in mind a few things:

- In general, rabbits do not like to be held in the air. If you are handling them, they will be most comfortable in their playpen or in your lap while you sit in a chair or on the floor
- Please remember that rabbits are VERY powerful. To avoid injury to both yourself and the bunny, don't try to hold any rabbit that is fighting to be put down.
- Rabbits LOVE treats - it's ok to give the rabbits a few goodies now and then, but please do not feed them excessively. This means pellets, too! Bunnies have a sweet tooth and will ignore healthy food in favor of treats.
- Ferrets are very social animals that love to play. They're also very clever animals that can open cage doors and slip out of play pens. If you take the ferrets out, be sure to supervise them at all times! They have even been known to open the cage of the cat carrier they are put in while their cage is being cleaned!
- Like cats and dogs, small animals may enter "fight or flight" mode when someone reaches into their cage. Remember that, because of their eye placement, rabbits cannot see you head on. When reaching into a cage to pet a rabbit, make sure they are able to see your hand before you touch them to avoid startling them.
- Have fun with them! Many people don't realize just how playful rabbits are. While some enjoy just stretching out on your lap while getting a good brushing, a surprising number of them love to chase a ball if you roll it across the floor for them!



Feel free to visit Alaina anytime if you have questions about how to handle the rabbits. We have a great group of small animals who are looking for some interaction!

You can raise money for the animals at CVHS just by doing your normal errands!



We're always looking to expand our donation bank program to include more locations. Currently, donation banks are located everywhere from health food stores to gift shops. Do you frequent a local store that might be willing to house a bank for us? Come to the next donation bank meeting on May 18th at 5pm at the shelter to learn more about how you can be part of this program that raises \$9,000 each year for the shelter. Current donation bank volunteers are welcome and encouraged to attend this meeting, as well. Maintaining a donation bank is easy and requires as little as a once a month pick up. ***Every dollar makes a difference!***
