CVHS Large Nonprofit of the Year




We are honored to have been named Dover's Large Nonprofit of the Year for 2016! Five other awards, including Small Nonprofit of the Year and Citzen of the Year,








Tails to Trails

We need volunteers for this special program who are able to commit to at least 1 to 2 hours each week for a minimum of 6 months. Enrichment activities include:


