

## Make an online fundraising page

## One a day

## Haunted Overload wins ABC's Great Halloween Fright Fight

It's safe to say that 2014 was the Year of Haunted Overload! This year marked our fourth Halloween season partnering with the local attraction. Each year, volunteers and staff members from CVHS assist with cleaning the haunt trails, construction, crowd control, directing parking, and even acting. At the end of the haunt season, Haunted Overload generously donates 10% of their profits to the shelter, a donation that has steadily increased over the years as the attraction has gained more and more attention both locally and nationally.

This year saw record-breaking attendance numbers as Haunted Overload was recognized on national TV as a top Halloween attraction. In September, a crew from ABC's Great Halloween Fright Fight, a

holiday special featuring over-the-top family Halloween displays and attractions, arrived at DeMeritt Hill Farm to film Haunted Overload. Hosts Sabrina Soto and Michael Maloney experienced all the thrills and chills of the haunt

and were clearly impressed with, not only the scale of Haunted Overload, but the creativity and craftsmanship, as well. As part of the show, Haunted Overload founder Eric Lowther would be competing against five other Halloween attractions around the country for a grand prize of \$50,000.

When the Great Halloween Fright Fight aired on October 28th, it was officially announced that Haunted Overload had been selected the winner. In a remarkable display of generosity, Eric and his wife Janice donated their \$50,000 winnings to the Bring Us Home capital campaign fund to help bring CVHS one step closer to a new building!

Thanks to the extra publicity from the Great Halloween Fright Fight, attendance numbers soared during the last few nights of the Halloween season. As a result, Haunted Overload's yearly donation
