Shelter Safety

Whether you're a seasoned volunteer or a newcomer to the shelter, it's always good to refresh your memory on some animal care safety tips. With so many dogs coming into the shelter from the Refugee Adoption Program, the dog adoption room can be a very hectic place. We want the shelter to be a safe place for our staff,

volunteers, adopters, and animals. With that in mind, please remember:

- * Before taking a dog out of its kennel, take a minute to **read the information on the cage card**. Is it shy? Is it excitable? Is it nervous around people wearing hats? For safety reasons, you always want to know as much as pos-
- * When in the adoption room, **only one dog should be out of its kennel at a time**. If a staff member, adopter, or volunteer has another dog out, you need to WAIT before entering the room or taking a dog out of its cage. Not all dogs are friendly with each other and

something as simple as walking past one another could provoke a fight.

sible about a dog before you take it out of its kennel.

- * Never take more than one dog on a walk at a time. If two or more dogs are in a kennel together, ask for assistance in getting one out. Even dogs that share a kennel could start a fight while on a walk.
- * Never mix and match dogs from different cages. Ever! You are putting yourself, other people, and the dogs in a dangerous position if you mix together two dogs from different kennels. This is especially important if you volunteer with one or more other people and everyone wants to walk their own dog.
- * Being aware of other dogs does not just apply to being in the shelter. **Whenever you pass through a door, be sure to check for dogs on the other side**. If there's a potentially dangerous situation on the other side of the door, YOU need to see it before the dog does.
- * Animals don't have to be running loose to start a fight they can fight right through the cage doors. **Always keep dogs close to you when walking through the kennels** to prevent them from running up to the cage doors.
- * Although it's great to see someone express interest in the dog you are walking, you do not want to allow potential adopters to approach you while you are handling a shelter dog. Some dogs are more nervous than others about meeting new people. If someone approaches you,
